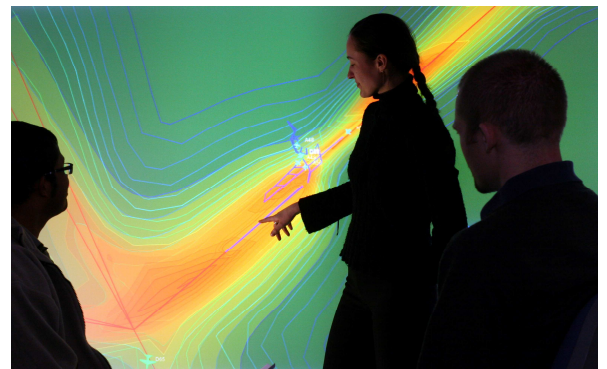
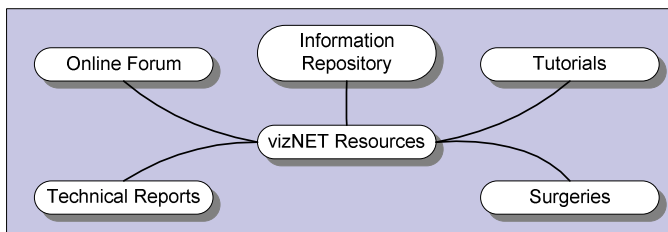


About vizNET

The UK Visualization Support Network (vizNET) exists to share visualization knowledge between academics from around the UK. This is achieved through the communication of best practice between application domains and provide training and support to researchers in visualization.

Researchers in science, engineering, the arts and humanities are generating ever increasing amounts of complex data. Analysis and presentation of this data in a meaningful and optimal manner relies on effective use of visualization techniques. vizNET consolidates the strengths of major visualization centres and groups across the UK to help realise the full potential of emerging visualization techniques and resources at a national and regional level. vizNET is funded by the Joint Information Systems Committee (JISC).

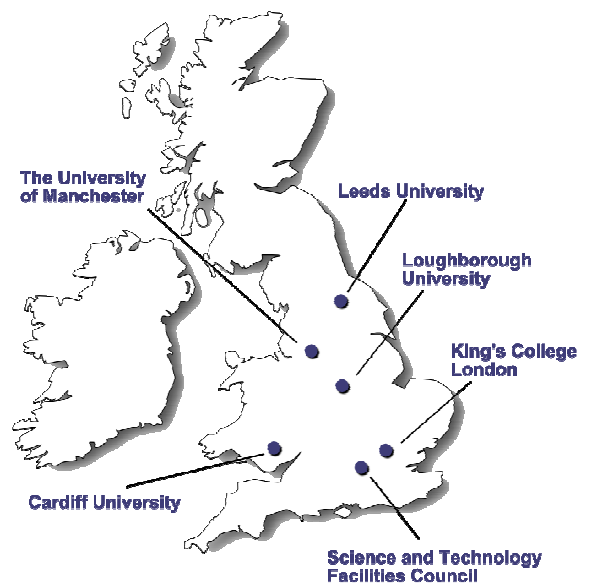


Activities

vizNET helps to expand the use of visualization through the organization of a number of dedicated workshops and seminars covering a range of visualization topics.

Seminars are broadcast live on the Internet using the AccessGrid collaboration software reaching people from around the UK. vizNET also provides the opportunity to utilise some of the UK's most advanced visualization facilities, immersing researchers in visualizations of their data.

In addition to these events, the five lead centres within vizNET produce a wide range of appropriate training and support materials for the visualization community. These materials range from technical know how to building giga-pixel display walls.
